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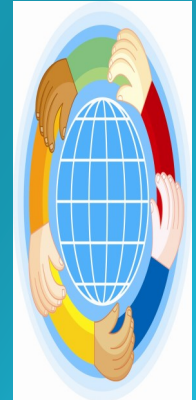

## **INTERVENTION SERVICES**

### **Who is eligible to participate?**

- **High school students & families who have been referred for intervention services by a high school administrator for discipline problems.**
- **Students & families (K-12) who have been referred by the district hearing officer.**
- **Students & families who are attending the district's alternative schools.**
- **Students & families who are interested in a particular program or service in which there is space available.**
- **Students &/or families who are referred by a district school counselor, social worker, psychologist or administrator for non-disciplinary related problems or concerns. These referrals require the completion of a referral form which can be obtained by calling 462-7072.**

### **FAMILY COUNSELING**

Intervention specialists who are trained as family counselors or graduate students under supervision, provide intake, assessment, and follow up counseling services to families whose student is involved in the disciplinary process or is experiencing other difficulties of concern to the school and the family.

### **INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING**

Intervention staff or graduate students may provide follow up counseling to students who have been referred to family counseling. Students will be accepted for individual services after meeting with the family.

### **BUILDING BRIDGES TO SUCCESS (BBTS)**

A multi family group (7 week) program that is provided to families of students at the alternative schools as well as other schools who have staff interested in leading the program. This program focuses on family resiliency, communication, development of helping skills, community service, and school success.

### **LATINO FAMILIES**

Families of our Latino students can be served by Spanish speaking therapists and provided individual, family and group counseling as needed.

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

Intervention staff have developed opportunities for our students to become involved in doing service in the community. Some of the sites of service include: the Salvation Army, Feeding the Homeless, and Tucker Center.

### **SERVICE LEADERS**

A program where students who have been referred for intervention services and exhibit leadership potential are given the opportunity to assume a leadership role in community service projects. Recommendation and interview required.

### **CLASSROOM OBSERVATION/ TEACHER CONSULTATION**

Staff counselors or interns can also consult with teachers or other school personnel regarding their concerns with intervention students.

### **SUPPORT FOR TEACHERS**

An opportunity for teachers to connect mind, body, and spirit; practice mindfulness; and engage in self-care.
