


Round Top Elementary Student Achievement Review

- All students in grades 3–8 except those who qualify for the alternative assessments.
- Both computer-based and paper-based tests were administered in 2016. Round Top Elementary students tested online.



2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary Students who Met or Exceeded Expectations by Subject





2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary Students Scoring in each ELA Performance Level by Grade Level





2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary Students Scoring in each Math Performance Level by Grade Level





2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary School Students Above the 50th Percentile by Subject





2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary Students Scoring in each ELA Percentile Ranking Quartile by Grade Level





2016 SC Ready - Percentage of Round Top Elementary Students Scoring in each Math Percentile Ranking Quartile by Grade Level





Percent of Students Scoring Met or Higher on 2016 PASS by Grade and Year




Read To Succeed

- Act 284 (Read to Succeed) was created to address literacy performance in our state, and put in place a comprehensive system of support to ensure South Carolina's students graduate on time with the literacy skills they need to be successful in college, careers, and citizenship.
- Research is clear that students who are not proficient readers by third grade are more likely to struggle academically, greatly reducing their chances of graduating from high school, going to college, or successfully participating in a 21st century high-skill economy.
- Requirements of Act 284:
 - By Spring 2020, all initially licensing teachers in South Carolina will have a Read to Succeed endorsement added to their licenses as part of completing their initial licensure.

Read To Succeed

- Requirements of Act 284:
 - Beginning with the 2015-16 school year, South Carolina teachers must complete professional development or coursework related to literacy to earn either the Read to Succeed (R2S) Literacy Teacher endorsement or requirement, depending on their certification area(s).
 - Each district must identify third grade students who are not reading proficiently on grade level and provide them with the opportunity to attend a summer reading camp.
 - Beginning with the 2017-18 school year, Act 284 requires that a student must be retained in the third grade if the student fails to demonstrate reading proficiency at the end of the third grade as indicated by scoring at the lowest achievement level on the state summative reading assessment that equates to Not Met 1 on the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS).
