By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, all faculty members will incorporate eLearning and AVID strategies into their professional practices in order for students to produce the desired learning outcomes.

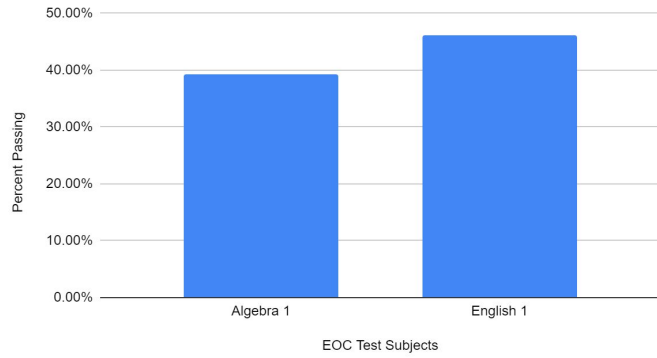
